state, and such records shall be accessible at all times, under suitable rules and regulations, to members of the Grand Army of the Republic and others engaged in the pursuit of historical information.

Section 2. The books of record, papers, relics, mementos and other effects of whatever nature, belonging to the said Department of Maine of the Grand Army of the Republic, shall, whenever said department ceases to exist as a departmental organization, become the property of the state of Maine.

When records, papers, etc., shall become property of the state.

Until the state shall have provided a building of suitable dimensions for providing the place or places contemplated by this act, such records, papers and property of the Grand Army of the Republic of the Department of Maine, shall be stored in some place in the present state house most convenient for that purpose, under the charge of the adjutant general, whenever they may be delivered to him by the department commander of this state, of the Grand Army of the Republic.

Chapter 150.

An Act to regulate fishing in the town of Durham.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish in any pond, brook or river in the town of Durham, in the county of Androscoggin, for a period of five years from the time this act takes effect, except through the months of June, July and August of each year it shall be lawful to fish in these waters, in accordance with the general law of the state, on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday of each week.

Fishing in town of Durham, regulated.

Section 2. During the open season on these waters it shall be unlawful for any one person to take, catch, kill or have in possession in any one day more than forty fish in all taken from these waters.

Number of fish that may be taken in one day.

Section 3. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general law of the state for the illegal fishing for and catching trout and landlocked salmon.

Penalty for violation of this act.

Section 4. In all prosecutions arising under this act, municipal and police courts and trial justices, within their respective counties, shall have, by complaint original and concurrent jurisdiction with the supreme and superior courts.

Court jurisdiction.
