Chapter 159.

An Act to regulate fishing in Horn Pond and Hanscom Brook, in York County.

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or

kill any kind of fish at any time in Horn pond, so called, in the

town of Limington, in York county, from the first day of October of each year to the first day of the following May. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time in Hanscom brook, so called, a tributary to Horn pond. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this section shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general law of the state for illegal fishing for and catching trout and land-locked salmon.

Court jurisdiction. Section 2. In all prosecutions arising under this act, police and municipal courts and trial justices, within their respective counties, shall have upon complaint, original and concurrent jursdiction with the supreme and superior courts, and all fines, forfeitures and penalties received for any violation of this act shall be paid forthwith by the person receiving the same to the state treasurer, and credited to fines and license fees for the protection of birds and game.

Chapter 160.

An Act to regulate fishing in Spear Stream and its tributaries in the town of Peru, in Oxford County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Fishing in Spear stream and tributaries regulated.

Penalty for violation of this act.

Court jurisdiction, Section 1. It shall be unlawful for a term of six years from the time this act takes effect, to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish in Spear stream, so called, or in any of its tributaries, in Peru, in the county of Oxford, except it may be lawful to fish in the tributaries of Spear stream, so called, on Tuesday and Saturday of each week, in accordance with the general law of the state.

Section 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act shall be liable to the same penalty as is provided in the general law of the state for illegal fishing for and catching trout and land-locked salmon.

Section 3. In all prosecutions under this act, municipal and police courts and trial justices within their respective counties,
