OPEN SEASON ON DEER-HUNTING IN BACK BAY.

Chapter 162.

An Act regulating the open season on deer on Swan's Island. Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. There shall be an open season on deer on Swan's open season island for one week in each year beginning the first day of deer on December, during which time it shall be lawful to hunt, chase, land. Section 1. There shall be an open season on deer on Swan's catch, kill and destroy deer in accordance with the general law of the state.

Nothing in this act shall be construed as author- Hunting on Section 2. izing the hunting, chasing or killing of deer on Sunday, whenever it occurs in the first week in December.

Section 3. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general law of the state for the illegal hunting and killing of deer.

Section 4. In all prosecutions under this act, municipal and police courts and trial justices within their respective counties shall have original and concurrent jurisdiction, upon complaint, with the supreme and superior courts, and all fines, forfeitures and penalties received for any violation of this act shall be paid forthwith by the person receiving the same to the state treasurer, and credited to fines and license fees for the protection of birds and game.

Chapter 163.

An Act to regulate hunting in Back Bay, so called, in Portland, in Cumberland County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to hunt, chase, catch, kill or destroy any wild birds or water fowl at any time in Back Bay, so called, in Portland, above the Grand Trunk railway bridge.

Section 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general law of the state for the illegal hunting and killing of game birds.

Section 3. In all prosecutions arising under this act, municpal and police courts and trial justices, within their respec- Court juristive counties, shall have, upon complaint, original and concurrent jurisdiction with the supreme and superior courts, and all fines, forfeitures and penalties received for any violation of this act shall be paid forthwith by the person receiving the same to the state treasurer, and credited to fines and license fees for the protection of birds and game.
