Chapter 168.

An Act to prohibit fishing in the tributaries to Flying Pond in the town of Vienna, Kennebec County, Maine.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Fishing in tributaries to Flying pond, prohibited.

—except in Sucker brook.

Penalty for violation of this act.

Court jurisdiction.

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time in any of the tributaries to Flying pond, which pond is situated in the town of Vienna, county of Kennebec and state of Maine, except in Sucker brook, so called, in which brook it shall be unlawful to fish only from Ernest Whittier's dam to said Flying pond.

Section 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general law of the state for the illegal fishing for and catching trout and land-locked salmon.

Section 3. In all prosecutions arising under this act, municipal and police courts and trial justices within their respective counties shall have, upon complaint, original and concurrent jurisdiction with the supreme and superior courts, and all fines, forfeitures and penalties received for any violation of this act shall be paid forthwith by the person receiving the same to the state treasurer, and credited to fines and license fees for the protection of birds and game.

Chapter 169.

An Act to regulate fishing in Overset Pond, so called, in the town of Greenwood, in Oxford County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Fishing in Overset pond regulated.

—number of fish that may be taken.

Penalty for violation of this act.

Court jurisdiction.

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time from September first of each year to June first of the following year, in Overset pond, so called, in the town of Greenwood, in Oxford county. During open season on this pond it shall be unlawful for any one person in any one day to catch and kill more than five trout and land-locked salmon in all in said pond.

Section 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general law of the state for the illegal fishing for and catching trout and land-locked salmon.

Section 3. In all prosecutions under this act, municipal and police courts and trial justices in their respective counties shall

have, by complaint, original and concurrent jurisdiction with the supreme and superior courts, and all fines, forfeitures and penalties received for any violaton of this act shall be paid forthwith by the person receiving the same to the state treasurer, and credited to fines and license fees for the protection of birds and game.

Approved March 15, 1909.

Chapter 170.

An Act to regulate fishing in the tributaries to Phillips Lake, in the county of Hancock.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time in Rowe brook, sometimes called Schoolhouse brook, Allen brook, Intervale brook, Hurd brook or Mountain brook, all of which brooks flow into Phillips lake, so called, in the county of Hancock, or in any other tributaries to said Phillips lake, except on Wednesday and Saturday of each week, on which days it shall be lawful to fish in said brooks in accordance with the general law of the state.

Fishing in Rowe, Allen, Intervale, Hurd or Mountain brooks, regulated.

Section 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general law of the state for illegal fishing for and catching trout and land-locked salmon.

Penalty for violation of this act.

Section 3. In all prosecutions arising under this act, municipal and police courts and trial justices within their respective counties shall have upon complaint original and concurrent jurisdiction with the supreme and superior courts, and all fines, forfeitures and penalties received for any violation of this act shall be paid forthwith by the person receiving the same to the state treasurer, and credited to fines and license fees for the protection of birds and game.

Court jurisdiction.

Approved March 15, 1909.

Chapter 171.

An Act to regulate fishing in Kennebago Stream, so called, situated partly in Franklin County and partly in Oxford County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish in Kennebago stream, so called, from In-
