all fires, stoves, pipes and flues in use for the purpose of heating, contained in any building, the keeping of ashes, and for the regulating of all such other matters as shall endanger property to destruction by fire or tend to spread fire rapidly; provided, the same are not repugnant to the laws of the state; and may enforce the same, and all rules, regulations, and orders of said fire wardens, acting as building inspectors, by penalties equal in amount to the penalties provided in sections thirty-one, thirty-two, thirty-three and thirty-four of said chapter twenty-eight of the revised statutes, but all said penalties shall be recovered by action of debt in the name and to the use of said Dover and Foxcroft Water District.

The appeal provided for in section thirty of said chapter twenty-eight, shall be to the assessors of said Dover and Foxcroft Water District.

Section 2. This act shall not take effect until it shall have been accepted by said Dover and Foxcroft Water District, at a legal meeting thereof.

Chapter 200.

An Act to extend and amend the charter of the Cornish Water, Light and Power Company.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The rights, powers and privileges of the Cornish Water, Light and Power Company which were granted by chapter three hundred and ten of the private and special laws of one thousand nine hundred and seven are hereby extended for two years from the date of the approval of this act; and the persons named in this act, subject to section two of this act, their associates and successors, shall have all the rights, powers, and privileges that were granted them by said act, to be exercised in the same manner and for the same purposes as specified in said act.

Charter extended and amended.

Section 2. Said act is hereby amended by striking out in the fourth line thereof the words "Frank G. Day, Bradley Allen."
