Chapter 203.

An Act to extend the charter of the Sagadahoc Trust Company. Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

The rights, powers and privileges of the Sagadahoc Trust Charter Company, which were granted by chapter one hundred and fitty-two of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and seven, are extended for one year; and the persons named in said act, their associates and successors shall have all the rights, powers and privileges that were granted them by said act to be exercised in the same manner and for the same purposes as specified in said act; provided, however, that said company shall actually commence business as a trust company within said one year.

Approved March 16, 1909.

Chapter 204.

An Act to incorporate the Maple Grove Electric Company. Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. Clarence A. Powers, James R. Thurlough, Corporators. Charles M. Waldron, Isaac Conant and Albert T. Hoyt, their associates, successors and assigns are hereby made a body corporate by the name of the Maple Grove Electric Company.

Section 2. The said corporation is hereby authorized to Purposes transmit, supply, sell and distribute electricity, for light, heat and power, in and through all that portion of the town of Fort Fairfield which was formerly township letter D, range one, according to survey and plan of said letter D township made by Thomas Sawyer, except that portion of said township particularly described in chapter one hundred and sixty-six, private and special laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-seven, entitled an act creating the Fort Fairfield Village Corporation.

Section 3. All locations upon streets, roads or wavs in said town, necessary for the purposes of this act, are hereby upon streets granted. granted and the municipal officers of said town of Fort Fair-
