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**Chapter 205.**

An Act to incorporate the trustees of an academy under the name of the Nasson Institute.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :*

Section 1. Harmon G. Allen, George A. Goodwin and Samuel D. Hanson with their associates and successors, are hereby created a corporation by the name and style of the trustees of an academy under the name of the Nasson Institute, for the purpose of establishing and maintaining an institution of learning in the village of Springvale in the town of Sanford, in the county of York, and by that name may sue and be sued, and have a common seal; may make any by-laws for the management of their affairs, not repugnant to the laws of this state, and may take and hold by gift, grant, devise, bequest or otherwise, any lands, tenements, or other estate, real or personal and may give, grant or lease the same; and may choose all officers necessary for the profitable management of their concerns and for the usefulness and advancement of said institute, provided, the sole purpose of said corporation shall be to inculcate and diffuse useful knowledge.

Section 2. The above named trustees, with such associates and successors as they may from time to time elect shall constitute the trustees of the said Nasson Institute. They may determine the number of trustees, the tenure of office and what number shall constitute a quorum of the board of said trustees, and how many thereof shall be residents of Sanford.

Trustees, number, tenure, and quorum.

Section 3. All deeds or conveyance of real estate, under the direction of the trustees of said corporation, and sealed with their seals, signed and acknowledged by their treasurer, shall be valid.

Deeds made valid.

Section 4. Said corporation is hereby authorized to receive any and all property of the estate of George Nasson late of Sanford, deceased, to be held, managed and disposed of for the purposes of said corporation, providing the transfer of said property as aforesaid be sanctioned and allowed by the judge of probate for the county of York and to be held under such restrictions and upon such conditions as the court shall authorize and direct.

Authorized to receive any and all property of the estate of George Nasson.

Section 5. Said corporation shall have all other powers, financial assistance and privileges as are given to academies and to similar corporations.

Powers, assistance and privileges.

Section 6. Any one of the persons named in section one, may call the first meeting of the trustees by notice served upon the others.
