CHAP. 230

Town au-
thorized to
construct a
bridge.

Section 1. The town of Boothbay Harbor is hereby authorized to construct a bridge over the tide waters of Boothbay Harbor in said town, beginning at the land of Pall G. Pierce, and running westerly to a convenient point on the westerly bank of said harbor, and lay out a public highway leading to and from said bridge.

Chapter 230.

An Act to set off a lot of land from Bucksport and annex same to the town of Dedham.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Land set off
from
Bucksport
and annex-
ed to Ded-
ham.

A certain piece of land, a portion of which is occupied by the Brookside cemetery is hereby set off from the town of Bucksport and annexed to the town of Dedham.

land set off.

Said parcel of land is bounded as follows: Beginning on the town line between Dedham and Bucksport at a point nearly opposite said cemetery, thence south fifty-six degrees west twenty-one rods and two feet to a stake; thence north thirty-one degrees west six rods and five feet to a stake; thence north fifty-two degrees east thirty-seven rods to said town line; thence south sixteen degrees east on said town line to place of beginning.

Chapter 231.

An Act to incorporate the Aroostook Mutual Fire Insurance Company.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Corpora-
tors.

Section 1. George W. Irving, E. L. Cleveland, Fred Simonson, D. W. Corey, C. A. Powers, G. M. Colbath, H. W. Safford, T. B. Bradford, E. S. Stackpole, E. S. Perry and R. L. Pitcher, with all other members that may hereafter be admitted to the company, are hereby made a corporation under the name of the Aroostook Mutual Fire Insurance Company, for the purpose only of carrying on business as a mutual fire insurance company for insurance upon potatoes, local or in transit, and upon potato-houses and other real and personal property in the county of Aroostook, with all the powers, rights and privileges, and subject to all the duties, liabilities and restrictions set forth in all the general laws of the state relating to such insurance companies, except as herein provided.

CHAP. 232

Section 2. Section forty-three of chapter forty-nine of the revised statutes shall not be applicable to said company. No policy shall be issued by said company until one hundred applications have been made in good faith.

Section 43, Chapter 49, R. S., not to apply.

Section 3. The agents of said company shall be licensed in the same manner as agents of mutual fire insurance companies.

Agents shall be licensed.

Section 4. Said company may write and issue policies upon potatoes in transit, upon land, in such form as may be agreed upon between it and the parties insured.

May insure potatoes in transit.

Section 5. Said company may ordain and establish such by-laws as are not inconsistent with law.

May establish by-laws.

Section 6. The first meeting of said company may be called by any of two said incorporators on seven days' notice by mail postage prepaid. Any incorporator may take part in such meeting by proxy.

First meeting, how called.

Chapter 232.

An Act to amend the Charter of the Rumford Falls Light and Water Company.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Sections two, four and five of chapter three hundred and sixty-five of the public and private laws of Maine, eighteen hundred and ninety-three as amended by section two of chapter two hundred and forty-three of the public and private laws of nineteen hundred and one, are hereby amended as follows:

Sections 2, 4 and 5, Chapter 365, special laws 1893, as amended by section 2, Chapter 243, special laws, 1901, further amended.

Section two of chapter two hundred and forty-three of the special laws of nineteen hundred and one is amended by adding between the word "Peru" and the word "in" in the fifth line the words 'Roxbury and Byron,' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

Section 2, Chapter 243, special laws, 1901, amended.

'Section 2. Said corporation is hereby authorized for the purposes of its organization, to take and hold, by purchase or otherwise any lands or real estate necessary therefor, and may enter upon and excavate through any lands when necessary for said purposes in the towns of Rumford, Mexico, Peru, Roxbury and Byron in the county of Oxford, or either of them. And for the purposes of its organization, said corporation is hereby authorized to take water from any stream, pond or river in said towns, or any one of them.'
