the purpose of caring for, beautifying and keeping in order generally, the cemetery situated in the town of Union aforesaid, a short distance from Union common and generally known as the Union cemetery.

—purposes.

Section 2. Said company is hereby authorized to receive from any person, corporation or other source, money or property and to hold and use the income from any such property for the purposes set forth in section one of this act, and no more. Said company is hereby authorized to make such by-laws as are necessary to carry out the provisions of this act. The first meeting of said company may be called by a notice thereof, signed by any five of the corporators herein named and served upon each corporator by publishing the same for three consecutive weeks in some newspaper printed in said county of Knox, the last publication to be at least seven days before the time of meeting.

May receive donations of money, etc., and use the income.

—first meeting how called.

Section 3. This act shall become null and void in two years from the time when the same takes effect, unless the corporation shall have been organized under this charter.

Chapter 289.

An Act authorizing the Maine Missionary Society to change its corporate name.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The Maine Missionary Society, a corporation organized under the provisions of chapter five hundred and twenty-six of the private and special laws, approved on the twenty-seventh day of January, eighteen hundred and seventy-one, is hereby authorized to change its corporate name, and adopt in lieu thereof such name as the members of said society may determine upon at a legal meeting thereof to be duly called and held for such purpose.

Change of name authorized.

Section 2. Whenever the name of said corporation is changed in accordance with the provisions of the preceding section, the secretary of said society shall file in the office of the secretary of state, the certificate required by the provisions of section forty-seven of chapter forty-seven of the revised statutes of this state.
