STATE TAX

For the Years 1909 and 1910

AUGUSTA KENNEBEC JOURNAL PRINT 1909 An Act for the assessment of a State Tax for the year one thousand nine hundred and ten, amounting to the sum of two million one hundred forty-three thousand one hundred fifty-six dollars and fortyseven cents.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. That each city, town, plantation, or any other State place hereinafter named, within this state, shall be assessed tax 1910. and pay the several sums with which they respectively stand charged in the following lists; the same being in addition to the poll tax of one cent on each poll, a tax of five mills on the dollar of the present state valuation for the current disbursements of the treasury for the year one thousand nine hundred and ten; and for the school mill tax provided by section one hundred and twenty-four of chapter fifteen of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter one hundred and eleven of the public laws of nineteen hundred and seven, and as further provided by chapter one hundred and seventy-seven of the public laws of nineteen hundred and nine.
