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**Chapter 49.**

Resolve in regard to appropriation due Spanish War Veterans for services rendered.

Resolved, that the sum of one thousand seven hundred seventy-two dollars and twenty-six cents be and is hereby appropriated for the payment of sums due Spanish war veterans for services rendered during the war with Spain, to be available from time to time as the claims are presented and approved by the adjutant general.

**Chapter 50.**

Resolve in favor of the Children's Heart Work Society of Maine.

Resolved, that there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of five hundred dollars to be paid to the Children's Heart Work Society of Maine for the use of said society for the year one thousand nine hundred and nine and five hundred dollars for the use of said society for the year one thousand nine hundred and ten.

**Chapter 52.**

Resolve in aid of navigation on Moosehead Lake.

Resolved, that the sum of twelve hundred dollars is hereby appropriated for the placing of buoys in Moosehead lake and the erection of lights in Moosehead lake and the maintenance of the same for the year nineteen hundred and nine, and the sum of twelve hundred dollars is hereby appropriated for the placing of buoys in Moosehead lake and the erection of lights in Moosehead lake and the maintenance of the same for the year nine-

teen hundred and ten. Said buoys and lights shall be placed at such points in Moosehead lake as will best serve the needs of navigation thereon. All said moneys shall be expended under the direction of the state steamboat inspectors; any part of the money hereby appropriated for the placing of buoys and maintenance of lights which shall be unexpended at the end of the year nineteen hundred and ten shall revert back to the state.

Resolve in favor of the town of Lisbon.

Resolved, that the sum of seven hundred and sixty dollars and seventy-six cents be appropriated to reimburse the town of Lisbon, in the county of Androscoggin and state of Maine, for money by it expended during the years nineteen hundred and two, nineteen hundred and three, nineteen hundred and four, nineteen hundred and five, and nineteen hundred and six, in furnishing pauper supplies to B. F. Abbott, a state pauper.

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### Chapter 54.

Resolve in favor of the town of Leeds.

Resolved, that the sum of sixty-nine dollars and seventy-five cents be paid to the treasurer of the town of Leeds for said town to reimburse it for money expended during the years nineteen hundred and seven and nineteen hundred and eight, for pauper supplies, furnished to George W. Wing, George F. Patterson and A. Nickerson.

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### Chapter 55.

Resolve in favor of the town of Paris, Oxford County, Maine.

Resolved, that the sum of one hundred and thirty-two dollars and fifty cents be and is hereby appropriated to be paid to the treasurer of the town of Paris for said town, the same being for moneys paid by said town for the expense of support of Lena Merrill at the Maine Industrial School for Girls. The said Lena Merrill having no pauper settlement in any incorporated town in this state, but was, at the time of her commitment, cared for by the town of Paris, at the expense of the state.
