CHAP. 72

And be it further resolved, that there be and is hereby appropriated a further sum of ten thousand dollars to be paid to said association in the year nineteen hundred and nine for the purpose of assisting in erecting, furnishing and equipping a building for a hospital in said Biddeford.

Chapter 72.

Resolve for the providing of testimonials for the honorably discharged Soldiers and Sailors who volunteered from Maine for Service in the Civil War.

Resolved, that one hundred and fifty dollars be and hereby is appropriated for the purpose of providing an additional supply of testimonials for the honorably discharged soldiers and sailors who volunteered from Maine for service in the Civil war.

Chapter 73.

Resolve. Providing for the Payment of Claims, Accounts and Demands against the State, Accrued Prior to January one, nineteen hundred and nine, and Remaining Unpaid by Reason of Insufficient Appropriations.

Preamble.

Whereas the various deficiency items comprised in this resolve are long overdue and further delay in the payment thereof will occasion great inconvenience to many departments of the state government and citizens of the state; and whereas in the opinion of this legislature these facts constitute this resolve an emergency measure, which is immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, now therefore be it

Resolved, that for the purpose of paying the several claims, accounts and demands against the state, accrued prior to, and remaining unpaid on January first, nineteen hundred and nine, by reason of insufficient appropriations, as reported to the legislature, by communication from the state auditor under date of January fifteenth, nineteen hundred and nine, in compliance with section five of chapter one hundred and forty-seven, of the public laws of nineteen hundred and seven, there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of one hundred two thousand, eight hundred seventy-four dollars, eighty-one cents, to be paid the several persons, firms and corporations named in said communication, respectively, the amounts therein reported, as follows:

Chapter 74.

Resolve for the purpose of erecting a fish hatchery in Knox County.

Fish hatchery, Knox County, for the erection of.

Resolved, that the sum of three thousand dollars be and is hereby appropriated for the year nineteen hundred and nine, and two thousand dollars for the year nineteen hundred and ten, for the purpose of erecting a suitable fish hatchery for the artificial propagation of fish and restocking the waters of Knox county and vicinity, the same to be erected at some point in said Knox county to be hereafter determined by the commissioners on inland fisheries and game, the same to be expended by the commissioners of inland fisheries and game.

Chapter 75.

Resolve in favor of the Children's Protective Society of Portland.

Children's Protective Society of Portland, in favor of.

Resolve, that the sum of five hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred nine and five hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred ten be and hereby is appropriated to be paid the Children's Protective Society of Portland, to assist the said society in its work in the protection and care of dependent and neglected children.
