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year, four hundred dollars; for salary of police at Pleasant Point each year, one hundred dollars; for educational purposes each year, twelve hundred dollars; for basket ash each year, three hundred fifty dollars; for school books each year, sixty dollars; for fuel for schools and church at Pleasant Point each year, one hundred seventy-five dollars; for insurance on church and homes each year, eighty dollars; for repair of road at Peter Dana's Point each year, one hundred dollars; for repair of road at Pleasant Point for nineteen hundred and nine only, one hundred dollars; for repair of buildings at Peter Dana's Point each year, fifty dollars; for repair of buildings at Pleasant Point each year, fifty dollars; for two United States flags for public buildings for nineteen hundred and nine only, twenty dollars; for balance due for completion of water works at Pleasant Point for nineteen hundred and nine only, two hundred eighty-eight dollars; for a building to contain two school rooms and a room where sewing and cooking may be taught at Pleasant Point for nineteen hundred and nine only, twenty-five hundred dollars; for furnace and completion of water system at Peter Dana's Point, for nineteen hundred and nine only, five hundred dollars.

Amount for nineteen hundred and nine, fourteen thousand four hundred thirteen dollars, and for nineteen hundred and ten, eleven thousand and five dollars.

Chapter 249.

Resolve in favor of the Penobscot Tribe of Indians.

Whereas, the state of Maine holds in trust for the Penobscot tribe of Indians a certain large sum of money, to wit, sixteen thousand nine hundred dollars, and whereas, all the funds appropriated by the seventy-third legislature for the care, maintenance and relief of said tribe have been expended for the purposes and in the manner prescribed by law, and because of the lack of available funds, said tribe may fall into distress and be deprived of proper food, shelter and clothing.

Preamble.

Whereas, by reason of the foregoing facts the appropriation called for in this resolve is immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and in the opinion of this legislature constitutes an emergency as contemplated by the constitution, be it therefore

CHAP. 250

Penobscot
Indians, in
favor of.

Resolved, that there be paid from the state treasury, to be expended under the direction of the governor and council, by the agent of the Penobscot tribe of Indians, for the benefit of said tribe for the years nineteen hundred and nine and nineteen hundred and ten, as follows:

Interest on tribe's fund, each year, fifty-three hundred fifty-three dollars and seventy cents; agricultural purposes, each year, eight hundred fifty dollars; annuity, each year, seventeen hundred dollars; bounty on crops, each year, four hundred dollars; salary of teachers, each year, one thousand dollars; incidental expenses for the schools and public buildings, each year, five hundred dollars; salary of agent of tribe, each year, four hundred dollars; salary of governor of tribe, each year, one hundred dollars; salary of lieutenant governor of the tribe, fifty dollars; constable for police purposes, each year, two hundred dollars; Roman Catholic priest, each year, two hundred dollars; superintendent of farming, each year, fifty dollars; for outstanding bills, fifteen hundred dollars, to be taken from the Indian Interest Fund; for the erection and completion of a home for the teachers, five thousand dollars; for medicine and medical attendance upon the members of said tribe, each year, one thousand dollars; for shore rentals, each year, twenty-five hundred seventy-two dollars and fifty cents, and that fifteen per cent of said shore rentals be appropriated and allowed for the use of municipal purposes.

In view of the facts recited in the preamble, this resolve, two-thirds of all the members elected to each house having so directed, shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 250.

Resolve in favor of the University of Maine.

Resolved, that the sum of nineteen hundred and forty dollars and ninety-four cents be hereby appropriated out of any funds in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the payment of certain bills for printing and binding done for the University of Maine during the year nineteen hundred and eight.
