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**Chapter 251.**

Resolve in favor of the Secretary of State.

Resolved, that the treasurer of state pay to the secretary of state the sum of four hundred and ten dollars for the purpose of furnishing to the several clerks of committees postage stamps for use of said committees.

**Chapter 252.**

Resolve for the maintenance of State Bridges located in the city of Old Town and the town of Milford.

Resolved, that there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of twelve hundred and fifty dollars for the year nineteen hundred and nine, and the sum of twelve hundred and fifty dollars for the year nineteen hundred and ten, for the maintenance of the bridges which reverted to the state under chapter four hundred and two of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and seven.

Resolve in favor of the Committee on Bills in Third Reading, for Clerical Assistance.

**Chapter 254.**

Resolve authorizing the Land Agent to release the interest of the State in the Islet called Turnip Island in Bristol, in Lincoln County.

Resolved, that the state land agent be and he is hereby authorized and empowered upon payment of a nominal consideration to make, execute and deliver a good and sufficient deed releasing to Albert Thorpe, of Bristol, Lincoln county, Maine, and his heirs and assigns all the right, title and interest which

the state of Maine has in and to a small island known as Turnip island, said island being situated southeast of Rutherford's island, together with its adjacent connecting and outlying rocks and reefs to the line of lowest tide on all sides of same, provided that said Thorpe shall first obtain a release from the persons now holding the claim to said island which Cyrus Jones, late of Bath, held in his life time.

Resolve that the Land Agent be authorized to convey to Joseph C. Harmon, of Stonington, Hancock County, Maine, Three Bush Island.

Harmon, of Stonington, Hancock county, Maine, the island known as Three Bush island, located northwest of Marshall's island, in the Burnt Coat division. The consideration of said island shall be a nominal sum.

**Chapter 257.**

Resolved, that the sum of one hundred eighty-one dollars and twenty-five cents, the unexpended balance of an appropriation in aid of the town of Bingham, voted by the seventy-third legislature, be and is hereby appropriated to aid the town of Bingham in building and repairing the highway landing to the Bingham and Concord bridge, to be expended under the direction of the county commissioners of Somerset county.
