Whereas, we deem this Nova Scotia coal as the natural supply for our state and other states of New England, and that no duty on this coal should be levied unless absolutely necessary for revenue, in which case this revenue is a direct tax upon our industries.

Free coal, resolve in favor of. Therefore, resolved, that we request our senators and representatives in Congress to use their influence for the repeal of such duty as now exists on all coal brought into the United States from Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, and from such other sources as their judgment may indicate.

Chapter 279.

Resolve to aid in the extension of the Kineo Road from the Smith Farm to the North East Carry.

Kineo Road, for extension of. Resolved, that there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of two thousand dollars to aid in the extension of the Kineo road. The same to be expended upon that portion of the road between the Smith farm and North East Carry at the head of Moosehead lake in Piscataquis county, under the direction of an agent to be appointed by the governor and council.

Chapter 280.

Resolve in favor of Jefferson C. Smith of Waterville, Maine, State Secretary of the Young Men's Christian Association.

Y. M. C. A., in favor of. Resolved, that there be and hereby is appropriated for the use of the Young Men's Christian Association, in aid of their work in connection with the encampment of the national guard to be held in Augusta, Maine, from August second to fourteenth, inclusive, the sum of three hundred dollars out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated for the year nineteen hundred and nine.
