Chapter 289.

Resolve providing for the payment of certain Deficiencies, accrued prior to January one, nineteen hundred and nine.

Whereas, the various deficiency items comprised in this resolve are long overdue and further delay in the payment thereof will occasion great inconvenience to the departments of state government and to the creditors of the state; and whereas in the opinion of this legislature these facts constitute this resolve an emergency measure, which is immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, now therefore be it

Preamble.

Resolved, that there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of twelve thousand nine hundred sixty-seven dollars and seventy-four cents for the year nineteen hundred and nine for the following purposes.
