#### INTOXICATING LIQUORS-IDENTIFICATION OF CRIMINALS.

**CHAP.** 4 dollars; all fines and penalties recovered, or money paid, under any of the provisions of this chapter, after deducting legal taxable costs, shall be paid forthwith to the treasury of the state by the person recovering the same.'

Approved February 25, 1911.

### Chapter 4.

An Act to repeal Chapter ninety-two of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and five, entitled "An Act to provide for the better enforcement of the laws against the manufacture and sale of Intoxicating Liquors."

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Chapter ninety-two of the public laws of nineteen hundred and five is hereby repealed.

#### Chapter 5.

An Act to facilitate the Identification of Criminals. Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. Prisoners who have been convicted of a felony and committed under sentence may, if deemed advisable, for the purpose of subsequent identification be measured and described in accordance with the Bertillon method for the identification of criminals, and their photographs and finger prints taken.

Chapter 175, public laws public laws of one thousand nine hundred and nine is hereby repealed.
