public any goods, wares, merchandise or other commodities. or for public weighing, conducting such inspection and test with as little interruption as possible to the prosecution of business; and if he finds any such weights, measures or balances inaccurate or defective he shall forthwith cause the same to be corrected or condemned. He shall cause the provisions of the statutes pertaining to weights and measures to be enforced, and for this purpose he shall have all the power and authority conferred upon the sealers of weights and measures in cities and towns, and shall have general supervision of all weights and measures in use in the state.

Section 3. The state sealer shall keep a record in detail of the work of his office and shall annually, on or before the first day of December, make a written report of the work and the expenses of his office to the governor and council.

Shall keep a record governor and council.

#### Chapter 83.

An Act relating to the Solemnization of Marriages,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The governor, with the advice and consent of the council, may appoint women, otherwise eligible under the constitution, to solemnize marriages.

Section 2. Women so appointed shall have the same rights Rights and and obligations in the solemnization of marriages as are had by justices of the peace.

#### Chapter 84.

An Act to amend Sections six, seven and eleven of Chapter fifteen of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and seven relating to the Protection of Trees and Shrubs from the introduction and rayages of dangerous insects and diseases, as amended by Chapter thirty-four of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and nine,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section six of chapter fifteen of the public laws of nineteen hundred and seven, as amended by chapter thirtyfour of the public laws of nineteen hundred and nine, is hereby amended by adding after the word "stock" at the close of the first sentence, the following: 'Such application shall be accompanied by a fee of ten dollars;' by striking out the word "fined"

Section 6 chapter public laws 1907, as amended by chapter 34, public laws 1909, further amended.
