Chapter 117.

An Act to repeal so much of Sections one and two of Chapter one hundred and fifty-seven of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and seven as requires and authorizes the holding of the term of the Supreme Judicial Court at Dover in the County of Piscataquis on the first Tuesday of May in each year.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

That so much of sections one and two of chapter one hundred and fifty-seven of the public laws of nineteen hundred and seven as requires and authorizes the holding of the term of the supreme judicial court at Dover in the county of Piscataquis on the first Tuesday of May each year, is hereby repealed.

Part of sections 1 and 2, chapter 157, public laws 1907, repealed.

Approved March 28, 1911.

Chapter 118.

An Act to amend Chapter two hundred and fifty-seven of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and nine relating to the Employment of Minors in Manufacturing or Mechanical Establishments.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section fifty-four of chapter two hundred and fifty-seven of the public laws of nineteen hundred and nine is hereby amended by inserting after the words "school committee" in the fourth line thereof, the words 'and such age and schooling certificate when duly issued shall excuse such child from attendance at public school', so that said section, when amended, shall read as follows:

Section 54, chapter 257, public laws 1909, amended.

'Section 54. Age and schooling certificates shall be issued by the superintendent of schools of the city or town in which the child resides, or some person designated or authorized in writing by the school committee, and such age and schooling certificate when duly issued shall excuse such child from attendance at public school; but no person shall issue such certificate to any minor then in or about to enter his employment or the employment of a firm or corporation of which he is a member, stockholder, officer or employee. The person who issues the certificate in accordance with the provisions of this section is hereby empowered to administer the oath provided for therein, but no fee shall be charged therefor.'

Age and schooling certificates shall be issued by superintendent of schools.

Approved March 28, 1911.
