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tions, which, however, need not be uniform,' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Section 42. Such banks and institutions are under the charge of the bank examiner for the purposes of examination. He shall visit every savings bank and institution for savings. incorporated by authority of the state, once in every year and as much oftener as he deems expedient. At such visits he shall have free access to the vaults, books and papers, and thoroughly inspect and examine all the affairs of each of said corporations, and make such inquiries as are necessary to ascertain its condition and ability to fulfill all its engagements, and whether it has complied with the law, and its officers shall, whenever required to do so by the bank examiner, furnish him with statements and full information relating to the condition and standing of their institution, and of all matters pertaining to its business affairs and management. He may prescribe the manner of manner and form of keeping the books and accounts of said corporations, which, however, need not be uniform. He shall preserve in a permanent form, a full record of his proceedings, including a statement of the condition of each of said corpora- be published. tions, a copy of which statement shall be published by such corporation immediately after the examination of the same, in a newspaper in the place where it is established, if any, otherwise in a newspaper published in the nearest place thereto.'

Chapter 159.

An Act to amend Chapter eighty-eight of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred seven as amended by Chapter one hundred thirty-eight of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and nine relating to compiling and teachings of local history and local geography in the Public Schools. Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Chapter eighty-eight of the public laws of nineteen hundred and seven, as amended by chapter one hundred thirty-eight of the public laws of nineteen hundred and nine is hereby amended by adding to section six the following words: 'or in making available by card catalog and otherwise historical materials in the possession of the state,' so that the said section six shall read as follows:

'Section 6. The state historian is authorized to expend, under Publication the direction of the governor and council, any portion of the matter and amount appropriated by this act, in the publication of historical matter and data relating to the history of Maine, or in making available by card catalogue and otherwise historical materials in the possession of the state.'
