Chapter 190.

An Act to repeal Chapter one hundred and forty-two of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and five relating to support of Alien Paupers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Chapter one hundred and forty-two of the public laws of Chapter 142, public laws neteen hundred and five is hereby repealed.

Chapter 142, public laws 1905 repealed. nineteen hundred and five is hereby repealed.

Chapter 191.

An Act to amend paragraph one of Section forty-two of Chapter fifteen of the Revised Statutes as amended providing for the payments from State School Funds of amounts paid on account of union Superintendence

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Paragraph one of section torty-two of chapter niteen of the revised statutes is hereby amended by the addition after the chapter 15, R. S., amend-Paragraph one of section forty-two of chapter fifteen of the Paragraph 1, word "year" in line fifteen of said section the following: 'and ed. provided further that the annual appropriation for payments under this act shall be deducted from state school funds,' so that said section when amended shall read as follows:

'Section 42. I. Whenever the chairman and secretary of Towns may said joint committee shall certify under oath to the state superintendent of schools, according to form prescribed by the state intendence superintendent that a union has been maintained and a superintendent employed as provided in sections forty and forty-one of this chapter, which certification shall be made quarterly, on the first days of January, April, July and October of each year, then, upon approval of said certificate by the state superintendent of schools, payment shall be made out of the sum appro--state aid. priated for superintendence of towns comprising school unions and out of any moneys in the treasury not otherwise appropriated to the superintendent so employed of a sum equal to twice the aggregate sum paid by the towns comprising the union, provided that the amount so paid for the benefit of a single -proviso. union of towns shall not exceed eight hundred dollars in one year, and provided further that the annual appropriation for payments under this act shall be deducted from state school funds.

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
