The state superintendent of public schools shall be authorized to expend for the special investigation of educational facilities as herein provided a sum not to exceed two thousand dollars which shall be deducted from the equalization fund and he shall annually publish in his printed report a complete statement relative to all disbursements as provided in this act.'

Chapter 193.

An Act repealing Section thirty-one of Chapter three of the Revised Statutes, relative to Certain Amendments.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section thirty-one of chapter three of the revised statutes is hereby repealed.

Section 31, chapter 3, R. S., repealed.

Chapter 194.

An Act relating to the compensation of the Trustees of the University of Maine.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Beginning with the first day of August, in the year of our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, the trustees of the University of Maine shall serve without pay, excepting that said trustees shall be entitled to receive from the state treasury out of any money not otherwise appropriated, after proper audit or voucher, a sum sufficient to defray any actual expenses incurred by them in connection with their duties whether for travel or other expense.

Trustees of U. of M. shall serve without pay, but are entitled to expenses.

Section 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith are repealed.
