Chapter 11.

An Act to regulate fishing in Clarkson's pond, so-called, situated in the town of Kittery, county of York.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. No person shall fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time in Clarkson's pond, so-called, situated in the town of Kittery, county of York, for a period of three years from the time this act takes effect.

Fishing in Clarkson's pond regulated.

It shall also be unlawful for any person to have in possession any kind of fish taken in violation of this section.

Section 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general law of the state for the illegal taking, catching, killing or having in possession of trout or land-locked salmon.

Penalty.

Section 3. In all prosecutions under this act, municipal and police courts and trial justices within their respective counties shall have, upon complaint, original and concurrent jurisdiction with the supreme judicial and superior courts, and all fines, forfeitures and penalties received for violation of this act shall be paid forthwith by the person receiving the same to the state treasurer.

Chapter 12.

An Act to empower the County Commissioners of York County to act under Chapter one hundred and seventy-nine of the laws of nineteen hundred and seven, entitled "An Act to provide a way to free toll bridges."

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The county commissioners of York county are hereby empowered and authorized to act under chapter one hundred and seventy-nine of the public laws of nineteen hundred and seven, entitled "An Act to provide a way to free toll bridges," in making all toll bridges now or hereafter located on the Piscataqua river, and its branches, between the states of Maine and New Hampshire, free, when the county commissioners of the counties of Rockingham and Straford, or either of them, in the state of New Hampshire, are empowered by the said state of New Hampshire to take similar action.

County commissioners of York County authorized to act under chapter 179, public laws of 1907.
