Chapter 32.

CHAP. 32

An Act to regulate fishing in Crosbyville Stream, so-called, in the towns of Avon, Phillips, Freeman and Strong, in the County of Franklin.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. For a period of five years from July fifteenth, in close time the year of our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, it shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time in Crosbyville stream, so-called, situated in the towns of Avon, Phillips, Freeman and Strong, in the county of Franklin. It shall also be unlawful for any person to have in -unlawful possession at any time any kind of fish taken in violation of in possession. any provision of this section.

Section 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall Penalty for be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general this act. law of the state for the illegal fishing for, or taking, catching, killing or having in possession of trout or land-locked salmon.

Section 3. In all prosecutions arising under this act, munici- court jurispal and police courts and trial justices, within their respective counties, shall have, upon complaint, original and concurrent jurisdiction with the supreme judicial and superior courts, and all fines, penalties, and forfeitures received by any person for -fines and any violation of this act shall be paid forthwith by the person how disposed receiving the same to the state treasurer.

Chapter 33.

An Act to regulate fishing in Little Pushaw Pond, so-called, in the town of Hudson, County of Penobscot.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time, for a period of two years from the time this act takes effect, in Little Pushaw pond, so-called, in the town of Hudson, county of Penobscot. It shall also be —unlawful unlawful to have in possession any kind of fish taken in violation possession. tion of this section.

Section 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall Penalty for violation of be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general law of the state for the illegal fishing for, or taking, catching, killing or having in possession of trout or land-locked salmon.
