Chapter 74.**CHAP. 74**

An Act to authorize the Town of York to construct a way across tidewater of Barrell's Mill Pond, so-called, in York Harbor.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

The inhabitants of the town of York are hereby authorized to construct and maintain a public pedestrian promenade across a bay of tidewater in York harbor locally known as Barrell's mill pond. The same to be constructed over and along the dam of said mill pond.

Chapter 75.

An Act to amend Section twelve of Chapter two hundred of the Private and Special Laws of Maine of the year eighteen hundred and ninety-nine, entitled "An Act to incorporate the Kennebec Water District."

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section twelve of chapter two hundred of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-nine is hereby amended by adding in the last line of said section after the word taxation, "except that real estate taken or held by said district outside the limits and confines of same may be taxed where the same is situate but nothing herein contained shall authorize the taxing of any part of the pipe line or any building used in the operation of said water system," so that said section as amended will read:

'Section 12. The property of said district shall be exempt from taxation, except that real estate taken or held by said district outside the limits and confines of same may be taxed where the same is situate but nothing herein contained shall authorize the taxing of any part of the pipe line or any building used in the operation of said water system.'
