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**Chapter 78.**

An Act to amend Section six of Chapter three hundred and forty-five of the Special Laws of nineteen hundred and nine, relating to the creation of a board of trustees for the Sullivan-Franklin Bridge, across the "Narrows" so-called.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section six of chapter three hundred and forty-five of the special laws of nineteen hundred and nine is hereby amended by striking out the words "the last day of March, nineteen hundred and ten, after," in the eighth and ninth lines thereof, so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Section 6. The following named citizens of Sullivan: C. H. Abbott, Will R. Harvey, H. H. Harvey, W. B. Blaisdell, Bradbury Smith, R. H. Springer, H. W. Dunbar and the following named citizens of Franklin: Lincoln Bragdon, F. E. Blaisdell, S. S. Scammons, F. Bradbury, W. Bragdon, W. A. Havey and John Fickett shall be and are hereby constituted the first board of trustees authorized by this act, and shall hold office until such bridge shall be completed and opened to the public.'

**Chapter 79.**

An Act to incorporate the Monmouth Electric Company.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1. D. D. Elliott, M. M. Elliott of Monmouth, Maine, and Carl F. Getchell of Auburn, Maine, their associates, successors and assigns are hereby made a corporation under the name of the Monmouth Electric Company. The purpose of said corporation shall be to make, generate, sell, distribute and supply electricity in the town of Monmouth in accordance with the general laws governing that business.

Section 2. Said corporation is hereby authorized to construct, own, maintain and operate manufactories and works for making, generating, distributing and supplying electricity in said Monmouth and to make, generate, transmit, conduct and distribute electricity in and throughout said town and to furnish, sell and supply the same for lighting buildings, public highways, streets and ways and for heating, manufacturing, mechanical and other purposes.

Section 3. Said corporation is hereby authorized for the purposes aforesaid subject to the laws regulating such uses, and with all the powers and privileges conferred on similar cor-
