CHAP. 158

Section 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general law of the state for the illegal taking, catching or killing of trout or land-locked salmon.

Penalty.

Section 3. In all prosecutions arising under this act municipal and police courts and trial justices within their respective counties shall have, upon complaint, original and concurrent jurisdiction with the supreme judicial and superior courts, and all fines, forfeitures and penalties recovered by any person for any violation of this act shall be paid forthwith by the person receiving the same to the state treasurer.

Court jurisdiction.

Chapter 158.

An Act to amend Section one of Chapter one hundred and seventy-nine of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred and five, relating to fishing in Marble Brook, and Marble Pond, so-called, tributary waters to the Piscataquis River, situated partly in the town of Blanchard, County of Piscataquis, and in Chase Brook, sometimes called Blackstone Brook, also situated partly in said Blanchard.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

So much of section one of chapter one hundred and seventy-nine of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and five as prohibits fishing in Marble brook and in Marble pond, so-called, tributary waters to the Piscataquis river, situated partly in the town of Blanchard, in the county of Piscataquis, and in Chase brook, sometimes called Blackstone brook, also situated partly in said Blanchard, in accordance with the general law of the state, is hereby repealed.

Portion of section 1, chapter 179, special laws, 1905, repealed.

Chapter 159.

An Act relating to the charter of the Hancock County Railway Company.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

The rights, powers and privileges of the Hancock County Railway Company which were granted by chapter three hundred one of the private and special laws of the state of Maine for the year nineteen hundred one, as extended and enlarged by chapter one hundred six of the private and special laws for the year nineteen hundred three, by chapter two hundred twenty-nine of the private and special laws for the year nineteen hundred five, by chapter seventy-three of the private and special

Charter extended for two years.
