Chapter 206.

An Act authorizing the construction of a bridge across the Piscataqua River.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Authority is hereby granted to the city of Portsmouth in the town of Rockingham, state of New Hampshire, and the town of Kittery, either or both of them to construct a bridge across the Piscataqua river at such a place and of such material and design as the secretary of war and congress may hereafter approve.

Bridge authorized across Piscataqua river.

Section 2. In lieu of building a new bridge, either or both of the above municipalities are authorized to lease any existing bridge over said Piscataqua river.

May lease existing bridge.

Approved March 28, 1911.

Chapter 207.

An Act to regulate the taking of Smelts in Great Brook and in Cold Brook, in the town of Stoneham and in the town of Lovell, in the County of Oxford.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be lawful to take smelts at any time in Great brook, so-called, and in Cold brook so-called, in the town of Stoneham and in the town of Lovell, in the county of Oxford.

Taking smelts in Great brook and Cold brook, prohibited.

Section 2. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed.

Inconsistent acts repealed.
