cute, acknowledge and deliver such deeds, conveyances, transfers or other instruments as may be necessary to secure to the town or district all and every right, title and interest whether in law or in equity which the said company may have in said sewer works and system.

Section II. Should said sewer works and system to be taken Town shall over by the town or district, as aforesaid, the consideration to be paid by the town or district therefor, shall be the fair market value of the said works at the time of taking, as may be agreed upon by the said parties thereto. And should said parties be unable to agree upon the amount to be so paid, the same shall be left to the determination of three persons to be chosen as follows: namely, one who shall not be a lawyer, to be selected by the company, one who shall not be a lawyer to be chosen by the municipal officers of the town, and another who shall be learned in the law, to be chosen by the chief justice of the supreme court, whose finding in the matter shall be final and conclusive between the parties.

Section 12. The affairs of said corporation shall be controlled by a board of directors consisting of not less than seven members, the majority of which shall be citizens of the town of Kittery, and elected annually by a vote of the stockholders of the corporation; and the board of directors shall choose such other officers as may from time to time be required by the bylaws of the corporation, provided however in the event of the corporation being acquired by the Kittery Water District it shall be controlled by the trustees of said district.

Chapter 252.

An Act to revive and extend the charter of the Kingman Development Company.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Chapter three hundred and twenty-three of the private and Charter respecial laws of the year one thousand nine hundred and seven tended. is hereby revived and continued in force and the corporators named therein are hereby given a further period of two years from the date that this act shall take effect in which to organize and commence business under said act.
