to be sold or exchanged, and all donations, gifts, grants, devises, or bequests made to said corporation for specific purposes shall be appropriated according to the will and design of the donor and in no other way.'

Chapter 263.

An Act to amend Section one of Chapter four hundred and twelve of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred and seven, as amended by Section one of Chapter one hundred twenty-one of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred and nine, regulating Fishing in Swift River and its tributaries, in the County of Oxford and in the County of Franklin.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

Section one of chapter four hundred and twelve of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and seven, as amended by section one of chapter one hundred and twenty-one of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and nine, is hereby amended by striking out the word "Monday" in the eighth line of said section, as amended, and by striking out the word "and" after the word "June" in the ninth line thereof, and by inserting after the word "July" in the ninth line thereof the words 'and August,' so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows :

Fishing in
Swift river
and tributa-
ries, regu-
lated.

'Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time in Swift river, so-called, or in any of the streams tributary thereto, situated in Rumford, Mexico, Roxbury, Byron and plantations D and E, in the counties of Oxford and Franklin, including Swift river pond, except that it shall be lawful to fish in accordance with the general law of the state in the river itself and in any of its tributaries on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday of each week during the months of May, June, July and August of each year. And no person shall catch, take or kill over thirty-five fish of lawful size in any one day from any or all of these waters, under a penalty of one dollar for each and every fish caught or killed in excess of said thirty-five.'
