CHAP. 269**Chapter 269.**

An Act to appropriate moneys for the Expenditures of Government for the year one thousand nine hundred and eleven.

Preamble.

Whereas, the appropriation of moneys for the maintenance of the several branches of the state government and its institutions is an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, now therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. In order to provide for the several acts and resolves of the legislature requiring the payment of money from the state treasury, and also to provide in part for the necessary expenditures of government, for the current fiscal year one thousand nine hundred and eleven, the following sums are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the state treasury, and, except where otherwise specially provided, the governor with the advice and consent of the council, is hereby authorized at any time prior to the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, to draw his warrant on the state treasurer for the same.

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For burial expenses of soldiers and sailors and the widows of soldiers and sailors, as provided by chapter four, sections sixty-five, sixty-six and sixty-seven, revised statutes, nineteen hundred and ten deficiencies, one thousand four hundred dollars,	1,400 00

For bounty on bears killed in Hancock county, as provided by chapter two hundred forty-five, public laws of nineteen hundred and nine, nineteen hundred and ten deficiency, five dollars, \$5 00

For bounty on bob cats, etc., as provided by chapter one hundred ninety-nine, public laws of nineteen hundred and nine, nineteen hundred and ten deficiency, forty-six dollars, 46 00

For new buildings, as provided by chapter one hundred eighty-two, resolves of nineteen hundred and nine, nineteen hundred and ten deficiency, twelve thousand five hundred and seventy-four dollars and fifty-eight cents, 12,574 58

For the Penobscot Indians, as provided by chapter two hundred forty-nine, resolves of nineteen hundred and nine, nineteen hundred and ten deficiency, one thousand one hundred seventy-seven dollars and forty-eight cents, 1,177 48

For prevention of contagious diseases among horses and cattle, as provided by chapter one hundred thirty-three, public laws of nineteen hundred and nine, nineteen hundred and ten deficiency, nine hundred fifty-four dollars and seventy cents, 954 70

For general expenses, as provided by chapter two, section twenty-five, revised statutes, nineteen hundred and ten deficiency, two hundred seventy-seven dollars and ninety-two cents, 277 92

For per diem and expenses of trustees of Maine industrial school for girls, as provided by chapter sixty-five, public laws of nineteen hundred and five, nineteen hundred and ten deficiency, twenty-seven dollars and sixty-four cents, \$27 64

For deficiencies, as provided by chapter one hundred thirty-five, resolves of nineteen hundred and eleven, three hundred twenty thousand, seven hundred eighty-three dollars and thirty cents, 320,783 30

For inquests and incidental expenses, as provided by chapter one hundred forty, section eleven, revised statutes, as amended by chapters one hundred eighty-five and one hundred eighty-nine, public laws of nineteen hundred and nine, nineteen hundred and ten deficiency, one hundred twenty-seven dollars and thirty-five cents, 127 35

Amounting to the sum of three hundred thirty-eight thousand seven dollars and eighty-seven cents, \$338,007 87

Section 2. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 270.
