Chapter 39.

Resolve in favor of the Town of Porter.

Resolved, that there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of four hundred and fifty-eight dollars and four cents to the town of Porter, said sum being the amount of reimbursement on account of the maintenance of a free high school.

Resolved, that the sum of forty-six dollars be and hereby is appropriated to be paid to the town of Hermon, to reimburse said town for amount expended for support of Mrs. Erick Nelson, a state pauper.

Chapter 41.

Resolve in favor of Arlington J. Day.

Resolved, that there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of thirty-five dollars and ten cents in favor of Arlington J. Day, of Wesley, Maine, to reimburse him for a balance due on a bill of supplies furnished to fire warden service in fighting fires on townships twenty-four, twenty-five, thirty and thirty-one, during summer of one thousand nine hundred and eight.

Chapter 42.

Resolve in favor of acceptance of gifts from ex-Governor Frederick Robie.

Section 1. Whereas ex-Governor Frederick Robie of Gorham is desirous of giving to the state forty shares of stock of the First National Bank of Portland, of which twenty shares are to be held as an amusement fund for the Eastern Maine Insane Hospital, and twenty shares are to be held as a library fund for the Maine Insane Hospital, and
