CHAP. 117

Chapter 117.

Resolve in favor of George H. Wilbur and Son, Contractors of Old Town, Maine.

Resolved, that the sum of three thousand four hundred and eighty dollars be and hereby is appropriated to be paid to George H. Wilbur and Son, contractors of Old Town, said sum being the amount due said company on a contract for the erection of a normal school building at Machias.

Chapter 118.

Resolve in favor of providing plans for School Buildings.

Resolved, that there be and hereby is appropriated from the state school fund the sum of two hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred and eleven and the sum of two hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred and twelve to provide for procuring architects' plans and specifications for school buildings by the state superintendent of public schools, said plans and specifications to be loaned to any superintending committee or school building committee desiring to erect a new building as provided for by chapter eighty-eight of the public laws of nineteen hundred and nine.

Chapter 119.

Resolve in favor of the State School for Boys.

Resolved, that there be and are hereby appropriated for and in behalf of the state school for boys the following sums and for the following purposes, namely: For the year nineteen hundred and eleven, for current expenses, thirty-six thousand dollars; for ordinary repairs and improvements, one thousand dollars; for providing homes for boys and visiting boys out on parole, five hundred dollars; for painting, five hundred dollars; for improvement of root cellar, three hundred dollars; for plumbing Farrington and Wentworth cottages, fifteen hundred dollars; for insurance premiums on state school property for term of three years, thirteen hundred and sixty dollars.
