CHAF. 127**Chapter 127.**

Resolve in aid of navigation on Rangeley Lake, Mooselucmeguntic Lake and Cusuptic Lake.

Rangeley, Mooselucmeguntic and Cusuptic lakes, in aid of navigation on.

Resolved, that the sum of one hundred dollars is hereby appropriated for removing obstructions and for the placing of buoys in Rangeley lake, Mooselucmeguntic lake and Cusuptic lake and for the erection of lights in Rangeley lake, Mooselucmeguntic lake and Cusuptic lake and maintenance of the same for the year nineteen hundred and eleven, and a like sum for the year nineteen hundred and twelve. Said buoys and lights shall be placed at such points in said lakes as will best serve the needs of navigation thereon. All said moneys shall be expended under the direction of state steamboat inspectors. Any part of the money hereby appropriated for removing obstructions, for the placing of buoys and lights and maintenance of lights which shall be unexpended at the end of the year nineteen hundred and twelve shall revert to the state.

Chapter 128.

Resolve in favor of Lee Normal Academy.

Lee Normal Academy, in favor of.

—proviso.

Resolved, that the sum of fifteen hundred dollars is hereby annually appropriated out of the school fund, for the term of two years, to Lee Normal Academy, an institution of learning located in the town of Lee, in the county of Penobscot; provided, however, that this appropriation is made on the express conditions that the trustees of said institution shall maintain and keep in operation a school equal in rank and grade of teaching with a first class academy, and in which shall be given special and systematic instruction in the science and art of teaching; that no part of this appropriation shall be devoted to other purposes than the payment of instructors in said institution; that the superintendent of public schools shall be ex-officio, a member of the board of directors thereof; and that if, in the opinion of the governor and council, said institution at any time hereafter shall fail to fulfill the conditions contained in this resolve, they may, in their discretion, withhold the appropriation herein granted; and provided, further, that said Lee Normal Academy shall not be entitled to any aid from the state for the years nineteen hundred eleven and nineteen hundred twelve in addition to that carried by this resolve.
