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**Chapter 129.**

Resolve in favor of the Maine Insane Hospital.

Resolved, that there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of one hundred ninety-two thousand three hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred and twelve, for the use of the Maine insane hospital.

**Chapter 130.**

Resolve in favor of Frank W. Colby.

Resolved, that there be paid out of the state treasury to Frank W. Colby of Augusta, the sum of sixty-eight dollars and ten cents for disbursements made by him in defense of a suit brought against him for acts committed in the line of his duty, as an agent appointed by the governor to enforce the provisions of the revised statutes relative to cruelty.
