**Chapter 136.**

Resolve in favor of Hannah E. Hodsdon for Pension, widow of Aaron Hodsdon, late of Seventeenth Maine Regiment, Company E.

Resolved, that there be paid out of the state treasury to the said Hannah E. Hodsdon of Yarmouth, in the county of Cumberland, a pension of six dollars per month, beginning on the first day of January nineteen hundred and eleven, and to continue during the pleasure of the legislature.
