Resolved, that there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of sixty-two dollars and twenty-nine cents to be paid to Holden Brothers of Jackman for boats and board furnished for fighting forest fires in the fall of nineteen hundred and eight.

Resolved, that there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of six hundred and sixty-three dollars and forty-five cents to be paid to Frank H. Sterling of Carratunk, to be by him paid to Alanson McKeown and forty others, as per list accompanying this resolve as a part of the statement of facts.

Chapter 146.

Resolve in favor of the Maine School for Feeble Minded.

provide for
expenses of.

Resolved, that there be and hereby is appropriated for the Maine school for feeble minded the sum of forty-five thousand dollars for the year nineteen hundred and eleven, and forty-five thousand dollars for the year nineteen hundred and twelve, for current running expenses, provided, however, that should the governor and council find that said sum is insufficient in either year to defray said running expenses, they may pay to the treasurer of said institution for its benefit such additional sum in each year as they may find necessary, out of any unexpended balance in the treasury not otherwise appropriated.

Resolved, that any of the appropriation for the year nineteen hundred and eleven remaining unexpended at the end of said year may be available for the year nineteen hundred and twelve.
