CHAP. 213**Chapter 213.**

Resolve in favor of B. H. Mayo.

B. H. Mayo,
in favor of.

Resolved, that the state of Maine be authorized by the legislature to pay to B. H. Mayo, the sum of twenty dollars on account of an error in mileage.

Chapter 214.

Resolve authorizing the State Land Agent to convey Lot No. Nine in Castle Hill, Aroostook County, Maine, to Samuel Maynard, of Castle Hill.

Resolved, that the state land agent be and hereby is authorized to convey to Samuel Maynard of Castle Hill, Aroostook county, Maine, whatever interest the state of Maine has in and to lot number nine located in Castle Hill in said county of Aroostook.

Chapter 215.

Resolve ratifying the proposed amendment to the Constitution of the United States, giving Congress power to lay and collect taxes on incomes.

Proposed
amendment
to U. S. con-
stitution rati-
fied.

Resolved, that whereas the Congress of the United States has proposed an amendment to the constitution of the United States which provides that "The Congress shall have power to lay and collect taxes on incomes from whatever source derived without apportionment among the several states and without regard to any census or enumeration."

And whereas it requires the ratification of three-fourths of all the states to make the proposed amendment a part of the constitution,

Therefore, resolved, that the legislature of Maine ratifies and adopts the proposed amendment to the federal constitution. That the secretary of state be directed to notify the secretary of state at Washington, D. C., of the action of the legislature.
