Chapter 223.**CHAP. 223**

Resolve in favor of the Joint Special Committee appointed to investigate the Financial Condition of the State.

Resolved, that the governor with the consent of the council be and is hereby authorized to pay the actual expense which may be incurred by the joint special committee to investigate the financial condition of the state. Such payment to be made from any unexpended money in the treasury.

Joint special committee, in favor of.

Approved March 31, 1911.

Chapter 224.

Resolve authorizing the Governor and Council to use any unexpended balance in the Treasury for the Care and Maintenance of Bridges and Highways.

Resolved, that the governor and council are hereby authorized to use from the unexpended balance in the treasury such sums as they may deem necessary for the repair of bridges owned by the state and for the repair and maintenance of highways on public lands.

In favor of state bridges and highways.

Approved March 31, 1911.

Chapter 225.

Resolve dividing the State into Executive Councillor Districts.

Resolved, that for the years nineteen hundred and thirteen to and including the year nineteen hundred and twenty-two the state is hereby divided into seven councillor districts, each of which districts shall be entitled to one councillor to be chosen in the manner prescribed by the constitution and laws of the state, as follows:

Councillor districts, division of state into.

First: Oxford, 1913, 1914, 1921, 1922; York, 1915, 1916, 1917, 1918, 1919, 1920.

Second: Cumberland, one for each year.

Third: Androscoggin, 1913, 1914, 1919, 1920, 1921, 1922; Franklin, 1915, 1916; Sagadahoc, 1917, 1918.

Fourth: Kennebec, 1913, 1914, 1919, 1920, 1921, 1922; Somerset, 1915, 1916, 1917, 1918.

Fifth: Waldo, 1913, 1914; Hancock, 1915, 1916, 1917, 1918; Knox, 1919, 1920; Lincoln, 1921, 1922.

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Sixth: Penobscot, 1913, 1914, 1917, 1918, 1919, 1920, 1921, 1922; Piscataquis, 1915, 1916.

Seventh: Aroostook, 1913, 1914, 1919, 1920, 1921, 1922; Washington, 1915, 1916, 1917, 1918.

Chapter 226.

Resolve, to apportion one hundred and fifty-one representatives among the several counties, cities, towns, plantations and classes in the State of Maine.

Apportionment of representatives, resolve for.

Resolved, that for the seventy-sixth legislature to and including that of the year nineteen hundred and twenty-one:

The county of Androscoggin shall choose twelve representatives to be apportioned as follows: Lewiston, five representatives; Auburn, three representatives; Lisbon, one representative; Poland, Mechanic Falls, Greene and Leeds, one representative; East Livermore, Livermore and Turner, one representative; Webster, Wales, Durham and Minot one representative.

The county of Aroostook shall choose fifteen representatives to be apportioned as follows: Hersey, Island Falls, Crystal, Sherman, Benedicta, Silver Ridge, Molunkus, Macwahoc, three, range four, two, range four, one, range four and one, range five, one representative; Linneus, Hodgdon, Cary, A, range two, Leavitt, Amity, three, range three, Glenwood, Haynesville, Orient, Weston, Bancroft, Reed, and four, range three, one representative; Houlton, one representative; Dyer Brook, Oakfield, Moro, Merrill, Smyrna, Limerick, Ludlow, Hammond, Littleton, seven, range three, seven, range four, seven, range five, eight, range three, eight, range four and eight, range five, one representative; Monticello, Bridgewater, Blaine, Mars Hill, C plantation, D plantation and E plantation, one representative; Easton, Westfield, Chapman, Mapleton, Washburn, nine, range three, and ten, range three, one representative; Presque Isle, one representative; Fort Fairfield, one representative; Caribou, one representative; Limestone, Caswell, Connor, New Sweden, Westmanland, Stockholm, Woodland, and sixteen, range four, one representative; Van Buren, Hamlin, Cyr, Grand Isle, seventeen, range three, one representative; Frenchville, St. Agatha and Madawaska, one representative; Fort Kent and Wallagrass, one representative; Eagle Lake, Hill, Allagash, St. Francis, St. John, New Canada, seventeen, range four, seventeen, range five, sixteen, range five, fifteen, range six, fourteen, range
