Chapter 64.

An Act Additional to Sections Ninety-six, Ninety-seven and Ninety-eight of Chapter Forty-nine of the Revised Statutes Relating to the Qualification of Insurance Agents and Brokers:

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Before an agent or broker is licensed as provided in sections ninety-six, ninety-seven and ninety-eight of chapter forty-nine of the revised statutes he shall file with the insurance commissioner a statement under oath, giving his name, residence, present occupation, his occupation for the five years next preceding the date of such statement and such other information, if any, as the insurance commissioner may require. After filing the statement herein provided the insurance commissioner may, if he is satisfied that the appointee is a suitable person, issue to him a license in accordance with said sections ninety-six, ninety-seven and ninety-eight of chapter forty-nine of the revised statutes provided, however, that it shall not be necessary for an applicant qualifying as an agent or broker for any particular company to re-qualify. The insurance commissioner may at any time after the granting of such license, for cause shown, and after a hearing, determine any person so appointed, or any person theretofore appointed as agent, to be unsuitable to act as such agent, and shall thereupon revoke such license and notify both the company and the agent of such revocation.

Before being licensed agent or broker shall file a statement with insurance commissioner.

Chapter 65.

An Act Repealing the Law Providing for the Inspection of Lime Casks.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

The following portions of the revised statutes of Maine, namely: sections two to seven inclusive of chapter forty, the first seven lines of section twenty-one of chapter one hundred and seventeen, the same being that part of said section relating

Chapter 66.

An Act to Amend Section Thirteen of Chapter Four of the Revised Statutes as Amended by Chapter Seventy-nine of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Seven and as Further Amended by Chapter Two Hundred of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Nine, Relating to the Election of Road Commissioners.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 13 of chapter 4, R. S., as amended by chapter 79, P. L. of 1907, as amended by chapter 200, P. L. of 1909, further amended.

Section thirteen of chapter four of the revised statutes as amended by chapter seventy-nine of the public laws of nineteen hundred seven and as further amended by chapter two hundred of the public laws of nineteen hundred nine is hereby further amended by striking out between the word "elect" in the first line of said section and the word "by" in the third line the following words: "and all towns with over sixty-five hundred inhabitants shall elect" so that said section thirteen of chapter four of the revised statutes as amended shall read as follows:

Election of road commissioner.

'Section 13. Each town at its annual meeting may elect by major vote a road commissioner, who shall hold his office for the term of one year from the date of his election, or for the term of three years from the date of his election if the town shall so vote. Any town may, at its option, elect not more than three commissioners, whose powers and duties shall be the same as prescribed for a single commissioner. No person shall, at the same time, hold the office of road commissioner and selectman.'

—any town may elect not more than three commissioners.

Chapter 67.

An Act to Amend Section Four of Chapter Seventy-eight of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Nine, Relating to the Better Protection of the People of Maine from the Disease Known as Tuberculosis.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 4 of chapter 78, P. L. 1909, amended.

Section four of chapter seventy-eight of the public laws of nineteen hundred nine is hereby amended by adding thereto the following words: 'but the methods or processes of disinfection and the material or agencies with which it shall be done shall be those which are advised by the state board of health
