and the first annual meeting of the board of trustees shall be held in the year nineteen hundred fourteen. Special meetings of the board may be held from time to time on the call of the president, and may be called by either the president or the secretary of the board by giving three days' notice thereof to each member of the board of trustees.

CHAP. 49

—special meetings, how called.

Section 8. Sections seventy-six, seventy-seven, seventy-eight, eighty, eighty-one and eighty-two of chapter fifteen of the Revised Statutes and all amendments thereof, and all other provisions of said chapter which may be necessary to carry into effect said enumerated sections for the benefit and best interests of this institution are hereby made applicable to and for the benefit of this incorporation; and it is provided that section seventy-nine of said chapter fifteen and all amendments thereof shall not apply to or affect the incorporation of said trustees nor this institution.

Certain sections of R. S. applicable to corporation.

—certain section of R. S. shall not apply to corporation.

Section 9. Any one of the persons herein named as incorporators may call the first meeting of this corporation by giving written notice to each of the incorporators of the place and time thereof three (3) days before the time for holding said meeting.

Chapter 49.

An Act to Extend the Charter of the Lincoln County Street Railway.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The time within which the Lincoln County Street Railway, a corporation organized under the general laws of the state, shall actually commence business under its charter, is hereby extended two years from the date when this act takes effect.

Charter extended for two years from time when this act takes effect.
