CHAP. 76 tion may maintain, operate and extend the same subject to the general laws governing that business.

Corporation may sell and distribute electricity in towns of Athens and Cornville.

Section 4. Said corporation may sell and distribute electricity for all purposes in the towns of Athens and Cornville, subject to the general laws governing that business.

Chapter 76.

An Act Ratifying the Organization of the St. Joseph's Convent and Hospital and Fixing the Value of the Property It May Acquire.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Organization of corporation is made valid.

St. Joseph's Convent and Hospital, a corporation organized under the laws of this state and located at Portland, in the county of Cumberland, which organization is hereby ratified, confirmed and declared to be legal and valid, is authorized and empowered for the purposes of its organization to receive, take and hold, by deed, devise, bequest, or otherwise, property, personal and real, to the amount of three hundred and fifty thousand (350,000) dollars, including all gifts, conveyances, bequests and devises heretofore made to said corporation.

Chapter 77.

An Act to Extend the Charter of the World's Standard Insurance Company.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Charter extended for two years.

The rights, powers and privileges of the World's Standard Insurance Company which were granted by chapter two hundred and nine of the private and special laws of the state of Maine for the year nineteen hundred eleven are hereby extended for two years additional, and the persons named in said act, their associates and successors, shall have the rights, powers and privileges that were granted to them by said act to be exercised by them for the same purposes as specified in said act.
