PRIVATE AND SPECIAL LAWS

OF THE

STATE OF MAINE

As Passed by the Seventy-Sixth
Legislature

Section 3. Said chapter six hundred and thirteen of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-three, as amended by chapter two hundred and seventy-eight of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and eleven, is further amended by inserting between sections twenty and twenty-two of said act the following section:

'Section 21. Trial justices are hereby restricted from exercising any jurisdiction in the towns named in section four of this act over any matter or thing, civil or criminal, except such as are within the jurisdiction of justices of the peace and quorum, and except as provided in sections four, eight and ten of this act, provided, that whenever the office of judge is vacant, any trial justice shall have and exercise the same jurisdiction as though this municipal court had never been established; as in such any civil or criminal action made returnable before a trial justice, shall be entered before and finally disposed of by such justice.'

Section 4. Chapter seventy-four of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and five is hereby repealed.

Section 5. Section four of chapter two hundred and seventy-eight of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and eleven is hereby repealed.

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Trial justices shall not exercise jurisdiction in towns named in section 4 of this act.

Chapter 115.

An Act to Amend the Charter of the Livermore Falls Light and Power Company, by Enlarging the Rights, Powers and Privileges of Said Company.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The rights, powers and privileges granted by chapter four hundred and seventy-two of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-seven, entitled "An Act to Incorporate the Livermore Falls Light and Power Company," as amended by chapter one hundred and one of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-nine, and as further amended by chapter two hundred nine of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and one, are hereby enlarged and extended by adding thereto the following:

'Section 1. The same rights, powers and privileges granted by chapter four hundred and seventy-two of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-seven, entitled "An Act to Incorporate the Livermore Falls Light and Power Company," as amended by chapter one hundred and one of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-nine, and

Chapter 472 of P. & S. laws of 1897, as amended by chapter 101 of P. & S. laws of 1899, as amended by chapter 209 of P. & S. laws of 1901, further amended.

Authority given to extend rights.

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as further amended by chapter two hundred and nine of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and one, are hereby granted to the said Livermore Falls Light and Power Company to extend to the towns of Canton and Dixfield in the county of Oxford, exclusive of the village of Dixfield.'

Towns of Canton and Dixfield authorized to contract for lighting, —excepted territory.

'Section 2. The towns of Canton and Dixfield in the county of Oxford are hereby authorized to contract with said corporation for lighting the streets within said towns, exclusive of Dixfield village, upon such terms as they may mutually agree.'

Rumford Falls Light and Water Co. may extend its system on river road in Canton.

'Section 3. The provision of this act shall not prevent or prohibit the Rumford Falls Light and Water Company from extending its system and furnishing light and power in the town of Canton, by way of the river road on both sides of the Androscoggin river and territory adjacent to the same from Peru and Mexico to said town of Canton, but not in the territory known as East Dixfield, Dixfield Center or Savery Hill, so called.'

Chapter 116.

An Act to Incorporate the Lincoln Light and Power Company.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Corporators.

—corporate name.

—purposes.

—rights, powers, restrictions, etc.

—may buy, lease and operate similar businesses.

Section 1. George H. Haynes, Elmer E. Haynes and Austin G. Haynes of Lincoln, in the county of Penobscot, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby made a body corporate under the name of Lincoln Light and Power Company with all the rights and privileges incident to a similar corporation, for the purpose of manufacturing, generating, selling, distributing, and supplying electricity for lighting, heating, traction, transportation, manufacturing or mechanical purposes in the town of Lincoln, in said county of Penobscot, or for any or either such purposes, with all the rights, powers and privileges, and subject to all the restrictions and liabilities by law incident to similar corporations; also for the purpose of buying, leasing and operating the property, rights, privileges, immunities and franchises of any individuals, firms or corporations doing or authorized to do a similar business in the town of Lincoln, aforesaid.

Katahdin Pulp and Paper Company may sell or lease its property.

Section 2. The Katahdin Pulp and Paper Company, a corporation duly existing under the laws of the state of Maine, is hereby authorized to make the sale or lease authorized by section one of this act.

Shall be located at Lincoln.

Section 3. The corporation hereby created shall be located at Lincoln, in the county of Penobscot and state of Maine.
