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CHAP. 144**Chapter 144.**

An Act to Renew and Extend the Charter of the Androscoggin Valley Railroad Co.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Charter renewed and extended.

All the rights, powers and privileges of the Androscoggin Valley Railroad Co. which were granted by chapter two hundred and thirty-four of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and nine are hereby revived and extended for two years.

**Chapter 145.**

An Act to Ratify and Confirm the Organization of the Augusta Poultry Experiment Station and Grant Additional Powers to Said Corporation.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Organization ratified and confirmed.

Section 1. The organization of the Augusta Poultry Experiment Station, a corporation organized under chapter fifty-seven of the revised statutes of the state of Maine, the certificate of organization of which company was filed in the office of the secretary of state on the twenty-seventh day of February, nineteen hundred and thirteen, is hereby ratified and confirmed.

Corporation may issue certificates of membership.

—may make by-laws.

Section 2. Said corporation shall have all the rights and powers specified in its certificate of organization, and may issue certificates of membership which shall represent the number of shares which the holder thereof owns, and by suitable by-laws prescribe the conditions on which such certificates shall be issued, held and transferred, and may prescribe voting rights and rules for the forfeiture of the same.

Corporation may change the number of its directors.

Section 3. Said corporation may by majority vote of its certificates of membership issued and outstanding, represented in person or by proxy, at a meeting called for the purpose, change the number of its board of directors.
