Chapter 238.

CHAP. 238

An Act to appropriate moneys for the expenditures of the Government for the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirteen.

Expenditures
of govern-
ment, import,
for 1913.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. In order to provide for the several acts and resolves of the legislature requiring the payment of money from the state treasury, and also to provide in part for the necessary expenditures of government for the current fiscal year one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, the following sums are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the state treasury, and, except where otherwise specially provided, the governor with the advice and consent of the council, is hereby authorized at any time prior to the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, to draw his warrant on the state treasurer for the same.

For military store house, as provided by chapter three hundred and five, resolves of nineteen hundred and thirteen, five thousand dollars \$5,000 00

BOARD OF STATE ASSESSORS.

For ascertaining the value of wild lands, as provided by chapter three hundred and twenty-five, resolves of nineteen hundred and thirteen, five thousand dollars 5,000 00

COMMISSIONER OF AGRICULTURE.

For packing and shipping apples, as provided by chapter one hundred and fifty-five, public laws of nineteen hundred and thirteen, fifteen hundred dollars 1,500 00

EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT.

For Commission Enlargement of State House, as provided by chapter three hundred and seventeen, resolves of nineteen hundred and thirteen, eight thousand dollars 8,000 00

For Lizzie Bean, as provided by chapter two hundred and nineteen, resolves of nineteen hundred and thirteen, three hundred dollars 300 00

For veterans of the Civil War in employ of the state, as provided by chapter ninety-three, public laws of nineteen hundred and thirteen, eight hundred dollars 800 00

CHAP. 238 For Lucinda P. Brackett, as provided by chapter two hundred and five, resolves of nineteen hundred and thirteen, ninety dollars..... 90 00

For interest on notes and purchases, and increase in salary, as provided by chapter two hundred and thirty-two, resolves of nineteen hundred and thirteen, eleven hundred dollars and fifty-nine cents 1,100 59

INLAND FISH AND GAME COMMISSION.

For bounty on bob-cats, as provided by chapter one hundred and ninety-nine, public laws of nineteen hundred and nine, as amended by public laws of nineteen hundred and thirteen, five hundred dollars 500 00

LAND AGENT AND FOREST COMMISSIONER.

For investigating cutting of timber on public lands, as provided by chapter two hundred and ninety-eight, resolves of nineteen hundred and thirteen, five hundred dollars 500 00

MAINE INSANE HOSPITAL.

For additional mangle, as provided by chapter two hundred and thirteen, resolves of nineteen hundred and thirteen, twenty-five hundred dollars 2,500 00

For piazzas for Harlow and Sanborn wings, as provided by chapter two hundred and ninety-five, resolves of nineteen hundred and thirteen, ten thousand dollars 10,000 00

To liquidate deficiencies in certain accounts, as provided by chapter three hundred and thirty-nine, resolves of nineteen hundred and thirteen, thirteen hundred and four dollars and sixteen cents 1,304 16

For repairs on building or buildings or new construction, twenty-five thousand dollars 25,000 00

MAINE STATE PRISON.

For payment of outstanding debts and obligations of the Maine State Prison, twenty thousand dollars 20,000 00

STATE HIGHWAY COMMISSION.

CHAP. 238

For land damage, Old Town and Milford bridge,
as provided by private and special laws of nine-
teen hundred and thirteen, ten thousand dollars 10,000 00

SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC BUILDINGS.

For Steward and Blunt, for extra labor and ma-
terials used in reconstruction of State House,
as provided by chapter three hundred and fifty-
one, resolves of nineteen hundred and thirteen,
one hundred and sixteen dollars. 116 00

STATE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

For schooling of children in unorganized town-
ships, as provided by chapter one hundred and
sixty-one, public laws of nineteen hundred and
thirteen, five thousand dollars 5,000 00

For school mill fund, as provided by sections one
hundred and twenty-two to one hundred and
twenty-seven, chapter fifteen, revised statutes,
as amended by chapter one hundred and eleven,
public laws of nineteen hundred and seven,
seven hundred and eighty-two thousand five
hundred and ninety-one dollars and sixty-four
cents 678,591 64

For common school fund, as provided by chapter
one hundred and seventy-seven, public laws of
nineteen hundred and nine, six hundred and sev-
enty-seven thousand six hundred and seventy
dollars and eighteen cents 677,670 18

UNIVERSITY OF MAINE.

For analysis of foods, seeds, etc., as provided by
chapter one hundred and thirty-nine, public
laws of nineteen hundred and thirteen, nine
thousand dollars 9,000 00

Amounting to the sum of one million, five hun-
dred sixty-five thousand, nine hundred seventy-
two dollars and fifty-seven cents. \$1,565,972 57
