Chapter 24.

CHAP. 24

Resolve, in Favor of Maella L. Gordon.

Resolved, that there be paid to Maella L. Gordon, divorced wife of Charles Horace Gordon, late of Mount Vernon, County of Kennebec and State of Maine, the sum of ten dollars per month, payable quarterly from the fund appropriated for military pensions, to begin January first, nineteen hundred and thirteen.

Chapter 25.

Resolve, for Extra Pay to the Maine Volunteers in the War with Spain.

Resolved, that the sums of sixty-six dollars for the year nineteen hundred and thirteen and sixty-six dollars for the year nineteen hundred and fourteen, be and are hereby appropriated for extra pay for the Maine Volunteers in War with Spain.

Chapter 26.

Resolve in Aid of Navigation on Moosehead Lake.

Resolved, that the sum of one thousand dollars is hereby appropriated for the placing of buoys and the erection of lights in Moosehead Lake and the maintenance of the same for the year nineteen hundred and thirteen, and the sum of one thousand dollars is hereby appropriated for the placing of buoys and the erection of lights in Moosehead Lake and the maintenance of the same for the year nineteen hundred and fourteen. Said buoys and lights shall be placed at such points in Moosehead Lake as will best serve the needs of navigation thereon. All said moneys shall be expended under the direction of the State Steamboat Inspectors; and any part of the money hereby appropriated for the placing of buoys and maintenance of lights which shall be unexpended at the end of the year nineteen hundred and fourteen shall revert back to the State.
