Chapter 61.

Resolve in Favor of the Maine Seed Improvement Association.

Resolved, that the sum of five hundred dollars be and hereby is appropriated annually, for the use of the Maine Seed Improvement Association for the purpose of encouraging the breeding and development of pure seeds; said appropriation to be expended in employing speakers, paying premiums and all other necessary expenses of holding an annual meeting of said association in Maine. This appropriation shall be expended under the direction of the Commissioner of Agriculture, upon the presentation of the proper vouchers.

Resolved, that the sum of ten dollars and eighty-one cents be and hereby is appropriated to reimburse the town of Newport on account of error in certificate for state stipend for free public library in said town for the year nineteen hundred and ten and nineteen hundred and eleven.
