Chapter 96.

CHAP. 96

Resolve, in Favor of Repairing and Rebuilding the Road from The Forks to Lake Moxie Station, in The Forks Plantation in Somerset County.

Resolved, that there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1000) for the purpose of repairing and rebuilding the highway leading from the village of The Forks to Lake Moxie Station, both in The Forks plantation, and county of Somerset; said road to be repaired and rebuilt under the supervision of the state highway department.

Chapter 97.

Resolve, Providing for Increase of State Pension for E. J. C. Owen.

Resolved, that there be paid to E. J. C. Owen of Buxton five dollars per month payable quarterly from the State Pension fund for soldiers, to begin April first, nineteen hundred and thirteen and continuing during the pleasure of the Legislature, and until otherwise ordered.

Chapter 98.

Resolve, Making Appropriations for the Passamaquoddy Tribe of Indians.

Whereas, the state of Maine holds in trust for the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians a certain large sum of money, to wit; thirty-three thousand one hundred and forty dollars and seventy cents, and whereas all funds appropriated by the seventy-fifth legislature for the care, maintenance and relief of said tribe have been expended for the purposes and in the manner prescribed by law, and because of the lack of available funds, said tribe may fall into distress and be deprived of proper food, shelter and clothing.

Whereas, by reason of the foregoing facts the appropriation called for in this resolve is immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and in the opinion of this legislature constitutes an emergency as contemplated by the constitution, be it therefore

Resolved, that there be paid from the state treasury, to be expended under the direction of the governor and council, to the agent of the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians for the benefit of said tribe for the years nineteen hundred and thirteen and
