Chapter 116.

Resolve, Providing a State Pension for Susan J. Tarr.

Susan J.

vor of state
pension for.

Resolved, that a pension of ten dollars per month be allowed and paid to Susan J. Tarr of Vinalhaven, Maine, widow of Franklin B. Tarr, a soldier in the civil war, beginning with the first day of January, nineteen hundred and thirteen, and continuing during the pleasure of the legislature and until otherwise ordered.

Chapter 117.

Resolve, Providing a State Pension for Vinnie E. Saunders.

Resolved, that there be paid to Vinnie E. Saunders, daughter of Elijah Saunders of Trescott, in the county of Washington and State of Maine, the sum of ten dollars per month, payable quarterly from the fund appropriated for military pensions, beginning January first, nineteen hundred and thirteen, and continuing at the will and pleasure of the Governor and Council.

Chapter 118.

Resolve, Providing a State Pension for James Lombard.

Resolved, that there be paid to James Lombard of Gorham, eight dollars per month from the military fund for soldiers, payable quarterly, beginning January first, nineteen hundred thirteen, and continuing during the pleasure of the legislature and until otherwise ordered.

Chapter 119.

Resolve, for Aid in Repairing the Rockland-Rockport Trunk Line.

Rockport-

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1000) to aid in repairing the Rockland-Rockport trunk line, provided there be appropriated by the towns of Rockland and Rockport, or otherwise, the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1000) for the same purpose; both sums to be expended under the supervision of the State Highway Department.
