CHAP. 200**Chapter 200.**

Resolve, Providing an Additional State Pension for Annie Jones.

Annie Jones,
to provide
additional
pension for.

Resolved, that there be paid to Mrs. Annie Jones of Parkman, widow of the late William Jones, a veteran of the Civil War, a pension of four dollars per month in addition to the pension granted her by chapter thirty-one of the resolves of nineteen hundred eleven beginning January first, nineteen hundred thirteen, and continuing during the pleasure of the legislature and until otherwise ordered.

Approved March 25, 1913.

Chapter 201.

Resolve, in Favor of the Nasson Institute for Maintenance and Extension of Its Work.

Nasson In-
stitute, in
favor of.

Resolved, that there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of one thousand dollars for the year nineteen hundred thirteen and one thousand dollars for the year nineteen hundred fourteen for Nasson Institute at Springvale, a vocational school for young women, for the maintenance and extension of its work, the same to be expended by and under the direction of the trustees of said institute. Provided, however, that said Nasson Institute shall not be entitled to any aid from the state for the years nineteen hundred thirteen and nineteen hundred fourteen in addition to the amounts carried by this resolve.

Chapter 202.

Resolve, Providing a State Pension for Mary Buswell Ridlon.

Resolved, that a pension of twelve dollars per month be allowed Mary Buswell Ridlon of Bridgton, in the county of Cumberland, the dependent widow of William H. Buswell, a soldier of the Civil War, beginning with the first day of January, nineteen hundred and thirteen, and continuing during the pleasure of the legislature and until otherwise ordered.
